



"We started with a full 3cm Cambria Colton™. A flat eased-edge profile was applied to the main horizontal countertop and a dado was then milled or routed into the bottom of the edge profile. The vertical pieces had a flat-edge profile applied to both the upper and lower edges. We dry-fitted the vertical pieces into the dado on the bottom of the main upper countertop piece."

BUTLER'S PANTRY

Fabricator Renato Otten with Select Surfaces in Franklin Park, IL, explained how they fabricated the cutouts in the unique backsplash in this butler's pantry:

"We wanted this to look like the backsplash was carved from one piece of stone, so it was important that the veining matched up throughout each individual piece. We used Slabsmith to map out all the pieces before cutting. Starting with one 3cm slab, we made the border pieces first, then milled the panels to 1cm and then added additional trim pieces, which were also milled to 1cm, to give more depth to the design."

Renato describes the process of using Cambria MerseyTM and SmithfieldTM high gloss 2cm slabs to create stunning entryway flooring:


"These tiles were all custom cut from Cambria's jumbo slabs. Since there were four different tiles in this pattern, we started by creating a digital template of the floor, so we could map out the layout before the installers ever got to the job site. To maximize the yield of the slab, we cut full-length strips, then cut the angles to create the shapes you see in the photo. Next, the edges were all chamfered to create a soft finish at the grout joints. Our installers floated the floor to get the surface perfectly level before setting each piece."
